

Sunday, 13 May 2018 The Ascension of the Lord – Year B



Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

The Ascension of Christ is an occasion of the deepest rejoicing for us. The glorification of Christ in this mystery is likewise our glorification, an elevation of our human nature. In human form Christ, our brother, enters heaven. In his human nature he sits upon the throne of God and will remain there for all eternity. We, of all God's creatures, enjoy a unique distinction: a member of our human race, our Head, is seated at God's right hand, his risen and glorious body still bearing the marks of the crucifixion.

In the liturgy, the Preface of the Ascension 1 expresses it this way:

Mediator between God and man, judge of the world and Lord of hosts, he ascended, not to distance himself from our lowly state but that we, his members, might be confident of following where he, our Head and Founder, has gone before. and, in the Preface of the Ascension 2:

For after his Resurrection he plainly appeared to all his disciples and was taken up to heaven in their sight, that he might make us sharers in his divinity.

The Ascension of Christ is therefore a celebration of our hope for eternal life with God. The only thing that will prevent us from following the risen Lord Jesus into heaven is our own unrepented mortal sins, the sort which, as the Compendium to the Catechism succinctly puts it, "destroys charity in us, deprives us of sanctifying grace, and, if unrepented, leads us to the eternal death of hell. It can be forgiven in the ordinary way by means of the sacraments of Baptism and of Penance or Reconciliation. One commits a mortal sin when there are simultaneously present: grave matter, full knowledge, and deliberate consent." (cf. 395)

So: go to Confession.

Next Sunday, of course, will be Pentecost, when our Cathedral Choir will be at the Vatican singing at the Pope's Pentecost Sunday Mass. I will be joining them there, God willing, and will pray at the tomb of the Apostle Peter for all of you who attend Mass at the Cathedral, St Columbkille's Woolloomooloo, Sacred Heart Darlinghurst and St Philip Howard's Norfolk Island. Please pray for the travellers!

First Reading Acts 1:1-11


A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 46:2-3. 6-9. R. v.6

(R.) God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

1. All peoples, clap your hands, cry to God with shouts of joy! For the Lord, the Most High, we must fear, great king over all the earth. (R.)

2. God goes up with shouts of joy; the Lord goes up with trumpet blast. Sing praise for God, sing praise, sing praise to our king, sing praise. (R.)

A reading from the first letter of St John

He made Jesus to sit at his right hand in heaven.

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The Lord Jesus was taken into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God.

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised is saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.

PRAYER TO PROTECT THE 8TH AMENDMENT OF **IRISH** THE CONSTITUTION. On May 25th Ireland will vote in a referendum to repeal the 8th amendment to their constitution. The 8th amendment gives equal rights to the mother and the child during pregnancy. If successful in repealing the 8th amendment the Irish government will bring forward legislation to allow abortions unrestricted up to 12 weeks gestation. Between 12 and 24 weeks gestation, abortion will be allowed if two doctors agree on a physical or mental health risk to the mother. The Irish Catholic Church has reached out to Catholics all over the world to ask us to participate in a prayer campaign to protect the 8th amendment. Parishes are asked remember this intention during Masses, rosaries, prayer vigils, adoration and fasting. Fr O'Flynn's last pastoral act was to leave the Blessed Sacrament reserved in a faithful Catholic's home so that the colonists and prisoners could come to adore Christ present there. For two years, the Blessed Sacrament, in this lay Sydney home, was the source and centre of worship and consolation for the priestless Catholics of the Australian colony.
