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Sunday, 03 June 2018 The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - (Corpus Christi) – Year B



Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

The solemnity of Corpus Christi is probably the celebration that communicates more than any other feast the sense of identity of the Catholic community. Catholics are well known to other Christian denominations for their belief in the consecrated bread and wine as the real Body of Christ, no less than that and nothing besides that. We are proud of this faith, and today we celebrate the gift of Christ's Body and Blood as the greatest gift of God to his children.

The Gospel of this Sunday is very rich and full of meaning. I would like to focus on one detail only: Our Lord wanted that the first celebration in which He gave his Body and Blood to the Apostles was to take place in an upper room. I am sure that in ancient Jerusalem, quite a few houses were provided with an upper floor and yet it was uncommon to have wide rooms and places to meet on the upper floor. Such an element invites all of us to notice that in order to enter the banquet God has prepared for us we need to access a higher level of understanding, that of Faith. As far as I can remember there is only one mention of another upper room in the Old Testament, which is the room that a widow prepares for the prophet Elisha staying in her house. She welcomes the one who is bringing the Word of God and at the end of the story, she receives as a gift the resurrection of her son.

Similarly, to receive the Body and Blood of Christ is to conform our entire life to Christ's teachings and to receive from the Lord himself his risen Body and, in the last day, the resurrection of our own bodies for eternal life.

A reading from the book of Exodus

This is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you.

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Second Reading Heb 9:11-15

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

The blood of Christ will purify our inner selves.

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives. how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

This is my body. This is my blood.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.'

After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.

The procession will follow the Blessed Sacrament through the Sydney CBD, finishing at the St Mary's Cathedral Forecourt with Adoration and Benediction. If you are unable to join us for the Procession, you are more than welcome to join us for Adoration and Benediction from approximately 3:30pm in the St Mary's Cathedral Forecourt. The event will conclude at approximately 4:30pm. The procession will help mark the 200th anniversary of a little known, but most heroic and faith-filled time in the history of the Australian Church. In 1818, the Government forcibly removed the only Catholic priest in Australia, Fr Jeremiah O'Flynn, from Sydney. Fr O'Flynn's last pastoral act was to leave the Blessed Sacrament reserved in a faithful Catholic's home so that the colonists and prisoners could come to adore Christ present there. For two years, the Blessed Sacrament, in this lay Sydney home, was the source and centre of worship and consolation for the priestless Catholics of the Australian colony. ABORTION CLINIC **EXCLUSION ZONES**: The "Public Health Amendment (Safe Access to Reproductive Health Clinics) Bill 2018" has passed NSW upper house and will be introduced into the Legislative Assembly soon. This new law will create exclusion zones around abortion clinics in NSW with the aim of preventing pro-life counsellors from approaching women. The prolife volunteers offer support and alternatives to abortion to vulnerable pregnant women, many of whom are coerced into seeking an abortion by others. The majority of women feel that they have no other choice other than to abort because they have no support. The pro-life volunteers offer practical support to these women, encouraging them to keep their babies.
