Sunday, 24 June 2018 The Nativity Of Saint John The Baptist



Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Today's liturgical commemoration of the Birth of John the Baptist reminds us that it is only six months to go until Christmas.... but well before then, there are several events coming up that I would like to draw to your notice:

29th June is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, a feast day when we especially celebrate our communion with the Church of Rome founded on these two Apostles;

30th June will be a special celebration for our neighbours in St Peter's parish, Surry hills as they celebrate their Centenary. Details are given elsewhere in this bulletin;

1st July is Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday when we especially acknowledge and celebrate the traditional owners of the land where we live and commit ourselves to the ongoing journey of reconciliation;

8th July is our Annual Marriage Mass and Renewal of Vows, which will take place at the 10.30 Mass that Sunday. Again, further details are given elsewhere in the bulletin.

The coming and going of these special days and anniversaries, however, should not lull us into a false sense of security. St John the Baptist cries out "Christ is coming!" There are some reading these words who will be dead before Christmas. The time to repent of sin and live a holy life is today, not tomorrow.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Behold I will make you a light to the nations.

Islands, listen to me, pay attention, remotest peoples. The Lord called me before I was born, from my mother's womb he pronounced my name. Gospel Lk 1:57-66. 80

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

John is his name.

The time came for Elizabeth to have her child, and she gave birth to a son; and when her neighbours and relations heard that the Lord had shown her so great a kindness, they shared her joy.

Now on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child; they were going to call him Zechariah after his father, but his mother spoke up. 'No,' she said 'he is to be called John.' They said to her, 'But no one in your family has that name', and made signs to his father to find out what he wanted him called. The father asked for a writing tablet and wrote, 'His name is John.' And they were all astonished. At that instant his power of speech returned and he spoke and praised God. 'What will this child turn out to be?' they wondered. And indeed the hand of the Lord was with him. The child grew up and his spirit matured.
