Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

During the week I blessed the tunnelling equipment and the workers at the construction site of the new Pitt Street Metro Station. It is customary among tunnelers and miners to invoke the intercession of St Barbara as they commence their work each day, and a small statue of the saint was blessed to keep on site while the work underway. is Such construction work is inherently dangerous for the workers, despite all the care and safety procedures in place, and there are many major construction sites all over Sydney, so I would ask you to stop and pray for all who are working in these big infrastructure projects that they will return safe and healthy to their families at the end of each shift.

There was some mud underfoot at the construction site, due to the little bit of rain on Friday morning: a reminder to keep the current drought in mind and to keep praying for rain where it is needed - although not so much rain here that it delays the laying of the new slates on the roof of the cathedral, as work on the College Street side of the Nave roof has now begun!

Next Sunday is a day of special significance for us, liturgically: the Anniversary of the Dedication of the Cathedral. You will notice candles lit at the crosses on the walls which mark where the walls were anointed with holy oil at its dedication. This celebration supplants the prayers and readings of the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time and replaces them with a special "propers." The physical building of the consecrated Cathedral symbolises for us the spiritual temple which is the Church, with us as its living stones. I hope you are able to come and pray with us in the cathedral next Sunday – pray for the Church in Sydney and around the world!

First Reading Jos 24:1-2. 15-18

A reading from the book of Joshua

We will serve the Lord God, because he is our God.

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel together at Shechem; then he called the elders, leaders, judges and scribes of Israel, and they presented themselves before God. Then Joshua said to all the people: 'If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve, whether the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are now living. As for me and my House, we will serve the Lord.'

Second Reading Eph 5:21-32

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

This is the great mystery, it applies to Christ and the Church.

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body – and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

Gospel Jn 6:60-69

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Lord, whom shall we go to? You have the words of everlasting life.

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before?

'It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life.

'But there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him.

Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'
