Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

The Catholic Church in Sydney is marking today as "Child Protection Sunday," coming at the end of the Australia-wide "National Child Protection Week."

These days everyone is more aware of the problem of child abuse. Evidence of crimes against children has been laid before us and we have been shocked by the amount of child abuse that has been done by Catholic clergy and religious and by the failures of bishops and religious superiors.

Moreover, our wider society is scarred by instances of neglect and abuse of children even by family members and those closest to them.

An important way of working to prevent harm to young people is to help them understand that they have the right to be safe, to feel safe, and to be respected. I would certainly encourage you who are parents and all who have the care of children and young people to help them know they should be safe, feel safe and be respected.

A poster, "The Safeguarding Journey", has been produced by the Safeguarding and Ministerial Integrity Office of the Archdiocese, and it is printed on a page in this newsletter so you can take it home and explain it, if you choose, to any children and young people in your family circle.

Gospel Mk 7:31-37

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'

The Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney invites young adults to pre-register for the WYD2019 Panama via Washington DC pilgrimage, which will be led by His Grace, Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP. Pilgrims wishing to accept the offer of a subsidy need to pre-register by depositing a minimum, non-refundable deposit of \$1,000. The deposit will confirm your place on the pilgrimage. The Archdiocese will then add \$1,000 to your account. The Indicative cost of the pilgrimage is \$8,686. For pilgrims considering the optional Mexico extension, the indicative total cost is \$9,786. 

What is Child Abuse?

Physical Abuse When someone hits you or hurts your body and makes you feel pain.

Emotional Abuse When someone calls you bad names, hurts your feelings or upsets you.

Sexual Abuse When someone touches your body in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable, or involves you in any sexual activity.

Neglect

When an adult who is looking after you does not take care of you. Not giving you food or clothes or shelter.

You can help yourself and others! If you tell a trusted adult that you or another child is being abused or hurt. that adult should help you straight away!

He/she will: LISTEN to what you have to say and help you to feel SAFE! They will TELL the appropriate people, who will get help for you.
