



# Sunday, 25 Nov 2018 Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe - Year B



Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Today the Church celebrates the last Sunday of the liturgical year with the feast of Christ the King. This commemoration is to draw our hearts and minds towards the ultimate fulfilment of all things in Christ.

Each Sunday we say together in the Creed that we believe that Jesus Christ "will come again in glory," but how should we understand this, and how does it pertain to Christ's "Mystical Body", the Church? For in a way, Christ's kingly reign and triumph is already present among us.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains:

I. He Will Come Again in Glory

Christ already reigns through the Church. . .

668 "Christ died and lived again, that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living." (Rom 14:9) Christ's Ascension into heaven signifies his participation, in his humanity, in God's power and authority. Jesus Christ is Lord: he possesses all power in heaven and on earth. He is "far above all rule and authority and power and dominion", for the Father "has put all things under his feet." (Eph 1:20-22) Christ is Lord of the cosmos and of history. In him human history and indeed all creation are "set forth" and transcendently fulfilled. (Eph 1:10; cf. 4:10; 1 Cor 15:24, 27-28)

669 As Lord, Christ is also head of the Church, which is his Body. (Eph 1:22) Taken up to heaven and glorified after he had thus fully accomplished his mission, Christ dwells on earth in his Church. The redemption is the source of the authority that Christ, by virtue of the Holy Spirit, exercises over the Church. "The kingdom of Christ (is) already present in mystery", "on earth, the seed and the beginning of the kingdom". (Vatican II, *Lumen Gentium* 3; 5; cf. Eph 4:11-13)

670 Since the Ascension God's plan has entered into its fulfilment. We are already at "the last hour". (Jn 2:18; cf. I Pt 4:7) "Already the final age of the world is with us, and the renewal of the world is irrevocably under way; it is even now anticipated in a certain real way, for the Church on earth is endowed already with a sanctity that is real but imperfect." (*LG* 48 # 3; cf. I Cor 10:11.) Christ's kingdom already manifests its presence through the miraculous signs that attend its proclamation by the Church. (Cf. Mk 16:17-18, 20.)

... until all things are subjected to him

671 Though already present in his Church, Christ's reign is nevertheless yet to be fulfilled "with power and great glory" by the King's return to earth. (Lk 21:27; cf. Mt 25:31.) This reign is still under attack by the evil powers, even though they have been defeated definitively by Christ's Passover. (Cf. 2 Th 2:7) Until everything is subject to him, "until there be realized new heavens and a new earth in which justice dwells, the pilgrim Church, in her sacraments and institutions, which belong to this present age, carries the mark of this world which will pass, and she herself takes her place among the creatures which groan and travail yet and await the revelation of the sons of God." (LG 48 # 3; cf. 2 Pt 3:13; Rom 8:19-22; I Cor 15:28.) That is why Christians pray, above all in the Eucharist, to hasten Christ's return by saying to him: (Cf. I Cor 11:26; 2 Pt 3:11-12). Maranatha! "Our Lord, come!" (1 Cor 16:22; Rev 22:17, 20.)

And so we will take up the cry, "Come, Lord!" next Sunday, as the time of Advent begins.

May you all have a happy and fulfilling week ahead.

#### **WORLD YOUTH DAY PANAMA 2019.**

The Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney invites young adults to pre-register for the WYD2019 Panama via Washington DC pilgrimage, which will be led by His Grace, Archbishop Anthony OP. Pilgrims wishing to accept the offer of a subsidy need to pre-register by depositing a minimum, non-refundable deposit of \$1,000. The deposit will confirm your place on the pilgrimage. The Archdiocese will then add \$1,000 to your account. The Indicative cost of the pilgrimage is \$8,686. For pilgrims considering the optional Mexico extension, the indicative total cost is \$9,786.
