Sunday, 16 Dec 2018 Third Sunday of Advent - Year C



Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Last Saturday's commemoration of the 150th Anniversary of the blessing of the foundation stone of the St Mary's was both prayerful and enjoyable, and the cathedral's place in the spiritual and cultural life of our city got a bit of newspaper and TV recognition, which was very encouraging. My sincere thanks to our staff who worked hard to prepare things for the celebration, and to those of you who were able to gather for the Mass and commemoration ceremony.

Preparations for Christmas at St Mary's Cathedral are well underway and the Schedule for Masses and Confessions is now available. This afternoon (Sunday) at 5.00pm we will have our annual Carols Service in place of Vespers.

Today at the 10.30 Mass we will be marking the 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human rights, with the assistance of the United Nations Association of Australia. The true significance of this landmark declaration has been somewhat overlooked in recent times, but as Archbishop Bernadito Auza, the Vatican's diplomatic representative to the United Nations, has observed, "Human rights are premised on the existence of a nature objectively shared by all members of the human race by the very fact of their humanity. From that nature flows human dignity, which refers to the intrinsic worth of every person, no matter one's circumstances, no matter how old or young, rich or poor, strong or vulnerable, healthy or sick, wanted or undesired, economically productive or incapacitated, politically influential or insignificant." The world has changed a lot in the past 70 years, and perhaps many have lost touch with just how precious the recognition human rights grounded in our very humanity is, and how deeply resonant with divine revelation!

May the God who made humankind in his own image bless you during the week ahead,

Gospel Lk 3:10-18

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

What, then, must we do?

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

MESSAGE FROM FR GERRY GLEESON, VICAR GENERAL OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF SYDNEY

You may have heard discussion in the media about the Church's participation in the National Redress Scheme for survivors of institutional child sexual abuse. The Archdiocese is committed to joining this Scheme. Senior church officials have spent the past few months finalising the procedures and documentation required for all dioceses linked to the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference to join the Scheme. This has been a complex process both for Church entities and for the Commonwealth Government.

A special company has been established, Australian Catholic Redress Ltd, by which dioceses will interact with the Redress Scheme. This week the bishops of Australia are signing the Participation Deeds by which their dioceses will join the Company and hence the Redress Scheme. It is anticipated that the various legal formalities will be completed in the coming weeks thereby allowing survivors of child abuse in Catholic parishes and institutions to apply for redress.

A number of Catholic religious congregations have indicated that they will separately join the National Scheme.

The Catholic Church, like other bodies and indeed some State governments, is not delaying its participation in the Redress Scheme, but simply taking the necessary time in conjunction with the Commonwealth to put the most appropriate procedures in place.

Survivors of institutional child sexual abuse are encouraged to approach the Redress Scheme or to approach the Church directly should they wish to do so.
