



Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

- After a difficult week, I find it helpful that the Gospel today is about the holy Transfiguration of Christ, where the light of divinity shines through the flesh of humanity. The three apostles who witness this are challenged to realise that they are part of something bigger than themselves: the unfolding of God's loving plan of salvation, which nevertheless is achieved through crucifixion and death. That light of divinity also permeates Christ's Mystical Body, the Church, is veiled, but in the end will shine forth and transfigure those who are united with our Lord
- Saint Patrick's Day is transferred to Monday 18th March this year due to the 17th being a Sunday of Lent. Bishop Brady will be celebrating a special St Patrick's Day Mass in the Cathedral on Monday at 10.30am.

- The solemn feast day of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is on Tuesday 19th. As St Joseph is "Patron of the Universal Church" and was the protector of the Infant Jesus it will be very good to invoke his prayers for the Church at this time.
- The New South Wales parliamentary elections are upon us. It is vital that Catholics, as good citizens, should vote thoughtfully. The Archdiocese of Sydney sent a list of thirteen questions on key areas of interest to the major and minor political parties, and their responses are collected in a State Election Guide which is printed in this week's Catholic Weekly, available near the doors. There are also copies of the Election Guide displayed in the large notice-board.

May the voice of the Son of God guide us all in the week ahead,

First Reading Gen 15:5-12. 17-18

A reading from the book of Genesis

God made a covenant with Abraham, his faithful servant.

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied, 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcasses but Abram drove them off.

Now as the sun was setting Abram fell into a deep sleep, and terror seized him. When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with Abram in these terms: 'To your descendants I give this land, from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'





St Mary's Cathedral has 14 stations arranged in order in which we visit to commemorate and pray. The stations are magnificent oil paintings painted in France, which were acquired by Cardinal Moran in 1885 during a visit to Europe.
