Sunday, 21 April 2019 Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of The Lord



Dear Parishioners and Visitors

I greet you with "Happy Easter!" on behalf of myself and the other cathedral clergy.

Just a few days ago we saw those dreadful pictures of Notre-Dame de Paris in flames. It was a shocking event. But we Australians know that after fire comes new life and growth. That is our experience after bushfires. It is also our experience as Catholics. Here on this site there have been two terrible fires, the first destroyed Old St Mary's Cathedral in 1865, the second burning down its temporary replacement in 1869. Yet with faith and hope the community

built the present magnificent St Mary's, and beyond mere stone and wood and glass, the living Body of Christ which is his Church continues on our pilgrim way.

After the 1865 fire, Archbishop Polding wrote: "Our dear old Cathedral of St. Mary's is in ruins. About the building were many sweet memories, sacred thoughts, which may not be uttered, associations of those that are no longer amongst us mingling with those that are still with us. Of these, then, my friends, what shall we say? There does exist a unity between the past and the future... Resurrection is not a creation; and though St. Mary's now lies lowly as it were, in her tomb, yet she shall rise again, more glorious, more stately than heretofore." Notice how the Archbishop made the point of a unity between what has died and what rises. At Easter we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus. He did not rise a completely different person with a completely new body. He arose the same Jesus, the same Christ, with the same body still with the holes from the nails and spear, and yet glorious, transfigured, radiant, effortless, not limited by time or space.

Because of that first great Easter, our response to such catastrophic events as the burning of a cathedral, and the other disasters that we have endured as a Church community and as individuals, should be one of confident hope and the joy of anticipation. We know that Our Lord must have something really wonderful in mind for us!


Liturgy...

First Reading Acts 10:34. 37-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

(R) This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

1. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end. Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.' (\mathbf{R})

Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise. The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: he goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious king, thy mercy show!




Second Reading Col 3:1-4

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians

Look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is.

Gospel Jn 20:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The teaching of scripture is that he must rise from the dead.

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Lk 24:1-12


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Why look among the dead for someone who is alive?

On the first day of the week, at the first sign of dawn, the women went to the tomb with the spices they had prepared. They found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb, but on entering discovered that the body of the Lord Jesus was not there. As they stood there not knowing what to think, two men in brilliant clothes suddenly appeared at their side. Terrified, the women lowered their eyes. But the two men said to them, Why look among the dead for someone who is alive? He is not here; he has risen. Remember what he told you when he was still in Galilee: that the Son of Man had to be handed over into the power of sinful men and be crucified, and rise again on the third day? And they remembered his words.

When the women returned from the tomb they told all this to the Eleven and to all the others. The women were Mary of Magdala, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James. The other women with them also told the apostles, but this story of theirs seemed pure nonsense, and they did not believe them.

Peter, however, went running to the tomb. He bend down and saw the binding cloths, but nothing else; he then went back home, amazed at what had happened.
