## Sunday, 09 June 2019 Pentecost Sunday – Year C



Dear Parishioners and Visitors

I have just returned from the Cathedral Parish Pilgrimage to Rome, which was a great experience. Highlights included visits to the Vatican and other Papal Basilicas, a General Audience with Pope Francis, an excursion to the Catacombs of St Sebastian, and the welcoming hospitality of Domus Australia, our own little slice of the Archdiocese of Sydney in Rome. After such a journey, one returns and sees things in a new way.

Today, Pentecost Sunday, we invoke

the Holy Spirit to renew the Church and the world. Among the most beautiful poetic prayers to be found in our Roman liturgy is the Sequence of Pentecost, which is to be sung, or at the very least said, before the Gospel passage at Mass. In it we pray that God, the Holy Spirit, would soften our hard hearts, to really transform us by His power. This, surely, is our constant need: to be shaped and moulded by God, to become ever limber in love and responsive to what we now see through the eyes of Christ!

First Reading Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

#### **Second Reading Rom 8:8-17**

#### A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.






