

Sunday, 16 June 2019 The Most Holy Trinity – Year C



Dear Parishioners and Visitors

"We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity there is no intrusion of any alien element or anything from outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energizing reality, selfconsistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the holy trinity is preserved."

Those are the words of Saint Athanasius, the great Archbishop of Alexandria, Doctor of the Church, who so wonderfully defended the

Church's true faith in the 4th Century against the false teachings of Arius which seriously misunderstood the relationship of God the Son to God the Father. The Council of Nicea in 325 expressed the true faith and rejected the errors of Arius, and we reaffirm this faith each Sunday in the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed when we speak of the Son as "consubstantial" with the Father.

Just a couple weeks ago, after the Cathedral Parish Pilgrimage to Rome, I had the opportunity to pray at the tomb of St Athanasius, which is in Venice (the Venetian Republic in the height of its power was great at acquiring the bodies of saints from their original locations...) Being in the presence of the mortal remains of St Athanasius reminded me of how blessed we are that the early Fathers of the Church defended the true and orthodox Catholic faith about God and Christ against the various errors which arose. They often paid a severe price for their fidelity to the truth, incurring the anger of the powerful, enduring exile and wrongful deprivation from their ministry, and worse.

Sadly after all these many centuries since the Council of Nicea there still emerge people with "new" (actually old) erroneous ideas about God and the Trinity, which may seem innocuous but which in fact can be very dangerous and distort the truth which Christ revealed. The Sign of the Cross, made in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, is more than an optional form of prayer or piety that it's OK to change as the individual may prefer. Those words Father, Son and Holy Spirit, are important expressions of true Catholic faith, as revealed by Jesus himself. We might have various concepts of God floating around in our mind from time to time, which may or may not be helpful. But that God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit is of divine revelation and unalterable, and it is important that we always be ready to affirm it. It is good to reflect on these further words from St Athanasius:

"It will not be out of place to consider the ancient tradition, teaching and faith of the Catholic Church, which was revealed by the Lord, proclaimed by the apostles and guarded by the fathers. For upon this faith the Church is built, and if anyone were to lapse from it, he would no longer be a Christian either in fact or in name." (Ep. 1 ad Serapionem)


First Reading Prv 8:22-31

The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. 
A reading from the holy Gospel according to John


