Sunday, 21 July 2019 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinal Time – Year C



Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We're celebrating "Marriage Sunday" at the Cathedral today, in honour of spouses wed here at St Mary's Cathedral and of married couples from across the Archdiocese marking significant anniversaries this year. This will be commemorated at the 10.30am Solemn Mass with the Archbishop, who has recently returned from his "ad limina" visit to Rome.

Appropriately, this Friday is the feast day of a married couple, Saints Joachim and Anne, the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. And a little over a week ago, July 12, was the feast day of another married couple, Saints Louis and Zélie Martin, who were the parents of St Thérèse of Lisieux. Zélie died in 1877, when Therese was only four and a half years old, and Louis died in 1894. Zélie and Louis were Canonised in 2015. Ss Louis and Zélie Martin actively took part in the Catholic movement of their time, living, as lay persons, the Christian spirituality in

professional activity and in giving an example of reciprocal love in their marriage and their family. Louis and Zélie's reputation for holiness was already strong during their lifetime and immediately after their death, within the family circle and the friends who knew them well. The publication of *Story of a Soul*, the autobiography of St Thérèse, contributed to making that reputation known more widely at the time, and I would encourage everyone to learn more about this saintly married couple and their remarkable family.

Congratulations to all the married couples among our congregations this weekend for your commitment to each other in all the joys and struggles of life – may the Lord bless you every day!

Lord, do not bypass your servant.

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said, 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said, 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree. 'Where is your wife Sarah?' they asked him. 'She is in the tent,' he replied. Then his guest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail and your wife will then have a son.'




