Sunday, 18 August 2019 Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C



Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

There seems to be a current trend in state parliaments around Australia to make laws which will require resistance, because they foster practices which are wrong in themselves, violating the natural moral law, such as killing the sick and the unborn.

Also, there are laws being passed now in parts of Australia which attempt to force certain citizens, that is priests, to violate their conscience by

breaking divine law and revealing to state authorities what they hear in the Sacrament of Confession.

However, citizens (including nurses, doctors and priests!) are not obligated in conscience to follow the laws of civil authorities if those laws are contrary to the demands of the moral order, to the fundamental rights of persons, or to the teachings of the Gospel. Any law which calls on people to cooperate in morally evil acts are unjust, and such cooperation must be – and will be - refused. Besides being a moral duty, such a refusal is also a basic human right which, precisely as such, civil law itself is obliged to recognize and protect.

As St John Paul II wrote in his Encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, "Those who have recourse to conscientious objection must be protected not only from legal penalties but also from any negative effects on the legal, disciplinary, financial and professional plane". (*Evangelium Vitae*, 74: AAS 87 (1995), 488.)

Just as the prophet Jeremiah was punished by the authorities on the basis that "he does not have the welfare of this people at heart", so those who refuse to cooperate in wrong acts may face punishment. We should not be surprised. As Jesus says in today's Gospel passage, "Do you suppose I am here to bring peace on earth? No. I tell you, but rather division." (Luke 12.51)

Please keep praying for our lawmakers – it's in everyone's best interests!

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

You bore me to be a man of strife for the whole world.

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,'

King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank.

Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said, 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiahout of the well before he dies.'




