

# Coronavirus Risk

This week the possible spread of the novel coronavirus strain has been on everyone's minds. With regard to reducing the risk infection when at church, please do exercise common sense and good hygene: If you are unwell, or have reason to think you might be contagious, then don't come to Mass and spread the germs. If you are worried about catching the virus, avoid shaking hands at the Sign of Peace,

and keep in mind that it might perhaps be possible for the fingers of the minister of Holy Communion to transfer the virus. Likewise if you are vulnerable to infection you might not use the Holy Water near the doors of the cathedral because many people will have touched the water and the bowl. Neither the Blessed Sacrament nor Holy Water is sterile or

antiseptic, let alone you, so please be considerate and sensible. We should pray for the efforts to contain the spread of this sickness to be successful and for the recovery of all who have caught it.

### Lent

Now that we are well into February I want to remind everyone that Lent begins this month on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Now is the time to start planning for your Lenten penance and prayer regime. Don't let Ash Wednesday catch you by "surprise" so that you just do your usual "no chocolate" routine. The ashes for Ash Wednesday are made by burning the blessed palms from last Palm Sunday. If you have any blessed palms at home from last year you can drop them off in the cathedral Office by Friday 21<sup>st</sup> February so they can be used.

### A reading from the prophet Isaiah

### Your light will shine like the dawn.

## A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

I came to you to proclaim Christ crucified.

When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.
