

THE INTRODUCTORY RITES

The Choir sings the INTROIT

cf. Isaiah 30:19,30; Psalm 79

POPULUS Sion, ecce Dominus veniet ad salvandas gentes: et auditam faciet Dominus gloriam vocis suae, in laetitia cordis vestri. ƿ. Qui regis Israel, intende: qui deducis velut ovem Ioseph.

O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart. ƿ. O shepherd of Israel, hear us, you who lead Joseph's flock.

All make the Sign of the Cross as the Celebrant says

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

PENITENTIAL ACT

Brethren (brothers and sisters), let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.

After a brief silence all say

I CONFESS to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do,

All strike their breast thrice, saying

**through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault;
therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.**

The Celebrant gives the absolution, saying

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.



HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH



Lift up your hearts. ℟. **We lift them up to the Lord.**


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. ℟. **It is right and just.**


All sing the MEMORIAL ACCLAMATION

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

℟. For the kingdom, the power and the glo-ry are yours now and for ev-er.


