Christmas Eve and Christmas Day usually draw thousands of people to Mass at the Cathedral. Midnight Mass, for example, usually sees three or four thousand trying to cram in.

THAT CANNOT HAPPEN THIS YEAR!

With a cap of 1200 people inside the Cathedral now in force, it will be absolutely necessary to book a place to attend any Mass on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

Please do NOT come without a booking and expect to be admitted to Midnight Mass, or any other Mass at Christmas. YOU WILL NEED TO BOOK **AHEAD**, and I expect demand for the available places will be high. With this in mind, some extra Masses have been added to the schedule for Christmas Eve and Christmas morning.

You will be able to book for these Masses from Friday morning, 11th December, via the St Mary's Cathedral website only. It might not be possible for you to get a spot at your preferred Mass time.

Use of hand sanitizer on entry is required. Wearing of facemasks is encouraged. Reception of Holy Communion on the hand

recommended. **Physical** distancing from persons not of household the same encouraged.

**COVID-19 update** 

In a welcome step forward for our churches in the lead up to Christmas, NSW Health has announced that from Monday 7 December, churches will be able to have unlimited numbers at all religious services, as long as a two square metre rule is observed.
