





and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

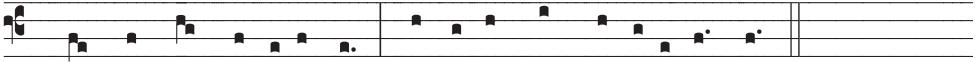


Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.
