### WORD FROM THE DEAN



Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed!

Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors.

How fortunate we are here, that we can come together to celebrate the Resurrection of Christ today. So many people around the world are still restricted in their ability to move around their towns and cities, to worship together and to gather with family and friends. So many people in other countries are getting sick and dying from Covid-19. Yes, many in our state and country are suffering from pandemic-related pressure on their jobs, businesses, health and wellbeing, and the recent floods have been heart-breaking for many in parts of New South Wales. And yes, there may be further difficult times ahead for us before this pandemic is over. But even so, we in Sydney are especially blessed, and today we have the opportunity to praise the Risen Christ and to ask him to bless everyone and free our world from all the effects of the Fall.

Since last Easter, which we kept in a time of great restriction and mostly closed churches, we have been able to return to a fuller programme of liturgical, devotional and pastoral life here at St Mary's Cathedral. My aim is that we should not return to what was "normal" before Covid, but that we should continue to expand the life of the cathedral in the service of the Gospel.

This is an important time in the life of the Church in Sydney, with the recent launch of the Mission Plan, "Go Make Disciples" and the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the foundation of the first St Mary's Cathedral here, in October; and the meetings of the Church's "Plenary Council" of Australia soon to be held. However, whatever we might hope for from plans and meetings and commemorations, what is most important is that each of you should know that the Lord loves you, calls you to be his friend and wants you to share your faith with your family and the whole world!


