WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners, Visitors and Friends,

We honour the fallen Anzacs this weekend, giving thanks for their sacrifice and praying for their souls and the souls of all who have died in war. We are mindful too of those who have served our country more recently. Too, too many of them are dying after their return from the theatre of war or resuming civilian life. Perhaps the recently announced Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide will help our community understand better how to help and heal. May the intercession of St Michael the Archangel and St Martin of Tours assist all who serve in our Defence Force.

Another commemoration with particular relevance to Australia and New Zealand occurs on Wednesday of this week: the feast day of St Peter Chanel, the first Martyr of Oceania. This young French Marist Father was a missionary on the island of Futuna, which lies in the Pacific between Fiji and Samoa. He was killed in 1841 and in 1849 his holy remains were brought for a time to Sydney, to the Marist establishment at Hunters Hill, before being taken to France. The Marist Fathers have a church named in his honour in Futuna Street in Woolwich in Sydney. There is a statue of St Peter Chanel here in the cathedral, in the reredos of the Altar of St Peter.




Theology of the Body Online Conference: 30 April – 2 May
