WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

Imagine, for a moment, that the Catholic Church in metropolitan Sydney, through a special Trust fund, had been caring for the graves of Catholics, and others, sensitively and respectfully for over 100 years, and had managed to set aside, in Trust, a very large amount of money that could only be used for caring for those graves for many generations into the future, and had also made provision for new cemetery sites to cater for Sydney's expanding burial needs.

Now imagine that the State Government, having failed itself to make provision for future burials, and the other cemetery Trusts having gone into decline and deficit, decides to grab the carefully managed Catholic Trust's money, and to get rid of the Catholic Church's stewardship of Catholic graves.

Surely, that would never happen?

But it is happening RIGHT NOW! The government led by our Premier, Gladys Berejiklian, is doing this RIGHT NOW!

- Instead of dealing with the problems of the non-Catholic operators, problems with which
 Catholic Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust was willing to assist and allowing the Catholic
 Trust to continue its good work, the Government has decided to abolish all operators,
 and create a new Government operator called OneCrown. This decision was a major
 backflip on previous conversations with Government, and is being opposed by the
 major faith groups.
- The Government will instead use the funds that have been saved up by the Catholic Trust to fix the problems left by the other providers. These aren't only Government funds, though. They have been contributed to by generations of people, mainly Catholics, for the upkeep of the graves of their loved ones.
- It is nothing more than a cash grab.

I find this situation outrageous, and I hope you do too.

It also seems likely that this action will lead to an increased cost for you to bury your loved ones; an increased push to "recycle" your loved-ones' graves; and no assurance that the graves of loved ones will be maintained long into the future, because a government bureaucracy does not have the same understanding of the need to care for the deceased that the Church does.
