"Saint who?..."

ear Cathedral Parishioners and friends all,

During this pandemic, social media thrives on our fears and our foolishness. Hence the seemingly unlimited videos of "Covid Karens" and "Covid Kens" in full flight. (With apologies to anyone who is named Ken or Karen).

Closed churches and a limited availability of the sacraments, and disruption to the rhythms of our religious life, as well as stayhome constraints movement and work, and the challenges of schooling really becoming increasingly difficult for everyone to bear. It is very troubling that many of our elderly are living in a forced isolation in aged care facilities and suffering mightily because of that. And there are very real questions about the fairness of the way people in some places are being targeted for greater restrictions than others.

This pandemic and the resultant restrictions are dragging on far

longer than most of us imagined. People are under stress and it can be a real challenge to keep your cool.

Even so, I have been looking through the Roman Martyrology – the official list of saints – and in the alphabetical list, under "K", there is no St Karen, nor even a simple St Ken.

Instead, listed under "K' are:

- Bl. K'adire, martyred by the Ottoman Turks in 1895;
- St Kenelm, martyred in England around the year 812;
- St Kentigern, a Scottish bishop of the early 7th Century;
- St Ketellus, a holy priest in 12th Century Denmark;
- St Kieran, an Irish bishop of the 6th Century;
- St Killian, an Irish missionary bishop martyred in Germany in the 7th Century;

- St Kinga, the Grand Duchess of Poland who gave away her wealth and ended her days as a holy nun in the 13th Century;
- And finally St Kizito, one of the companions of St Charles Lwanga martyred in Uganda in 1886.

These are far better people for us to emulate than Covid Karen and Covid Ken.

Speaking of saints, it is the feast of Our Lady's Birthday on Wednesday, September 8th, so why not give her a gift on that day: perhaps a few extra prayers and a kind act - such as a phone call to someone you know who might be lonely?




