"In Time of Earthquake"

ear Cathedral Parishioners and friends all,

I did not feel anything of the earthquake on Wednesday, though there were reports of buildings shaking this far away from the epicentre near Melbourne. When reports of a quake in Victoria came through, I was anxious to learn if St Patrick's Cathedral, Melbourne with its enormously tall central spire had suffered any damage, but apparently all is OK.

Many of you may remember when our own spires were being built, over 20 years ago now! Although they were built according to William Wardell's original design from the 1860's, modern rules, especially ones introduced after the Newcastle Earthquake of 1989, meant that the southern towers had to be strengthened and the spires themselves made quake-proof by being constructed with steel seismic reinforcement frames inside the load-bearing sandstone of the spires. In a clever bit of engineering, the cranes needed to lift the sandstone blocks were mounted on the top of the seismic frames!

As I was an Assistant Priest at the cathedral then, I got to see the fascinating design and construction process, and from time to time I was able to ascend and see the work progressing up close.

Here is a photo from 1999, with myself, Monsignor Tony Doherty (the Dean at that time) and a VIP visitor, Cardinal Roger Mahoney, Archbishop of Los Angeles, California, who was building a new, earthquake-proof, cathedral in that quake-prone metropolis. We are standing on the platform built over the cathedral roof between the two towers, with the seismic frame and the first few courses of stone of the South West Spire behind us.



Needless to say, Holy Mother Church is prepared for pretty much any eventuality, and so there is a special Mass "In Time of Earthquake" in the Missal. Here is the Collect Prayer for that Mass:

O God, who set the earth on its firm foundation, spare those who are fearful and show favour to those who implore you, so that, with all dangers of earthquake entirely gone,

we may continue to experience your mercy and serve you in thankfulness, safe under your protection.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever. Amen.

If we do have another earthquake nearby, the spires are perhaps more resilient than the rest of the building. God willing, we'll never have to find out for sure.

May we all have a steady week ahead!





