## WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

### "He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him" - John 2.11

Although the Christmas/Epiphany season has concluded, the Gospel today for this 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday following Epiphany in "Year C" is one of the traditional Epiphany mysteries (the others being the visit of the Wise Men from the East and the Baptism of Jesus) the changing of water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana.

Water is good, indeed it is indispensable for life and we need it to quench our thirst and cleanse our bodies. Water is a gift from God given to and for all His creatures.

Wine is something less universal, more especially associated with fellowship, with mealtime, with discussion, with celebration, with social interaction, with ritual and sacrifice and remembrance, with culture and skill and planting and growing, with sweetness and colour and fragrance, with knowledge and planting and harvesting and crafting.

Animals and plants have no use for wine. Angels have no use for wine. God has no need of it for Himself. Wine is for us! Normally, we make it. At the wedding feast at Cana, God made it. And Christ also chose wine as the element that would become his very Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Which goes to show, not how special wine is but how special humankind is, that God would adopt something which we invented, the product of human ingenuity and the work of human hands, as the sign and proof of divine love and divine presence. Even so, without water, and without the grape - both of which were created by God, not by us - wine would be impossible. God is the source of all, and needs nothing, yet He gives us intellect and will, invites us to know and love Him, and allows our humanity to mingle with his divinity.

We look forward to eternal life with Christ, who is the source of our hope. The sadness of death gives way to the bright promise of immortality, and I invite you to pray for the soul of Archbishop Anthony Fisher's mother Gloria, who died this week, and the soul of Cardinal George Pell's sister Margaret, who died late last year.

May they be numbered among those at the Wedding Feast of the Lamb, and may all of us join them there in the fullness of God's time.
