

All strike their breast thrice, saying



The Celebrant gives the absolution, saying



HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH


and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

I run the way of your commandments for you enlarge my heart to take them. With my lips I declare all the decrees you tell me. R.


Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.
