

The disciple is not superior to his teacher; the fully trained disciple will always be like his teacher. Why do you observe the splinter in your brother's eye and never notice the plank in your own? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take out the splinter that is in your eye," when you cannot see the plank in your own? Hypocrite! Take the plank out of your own eye first, and then you will see clearly enough to take out the splinter that is in your brother's eye. 'There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit. For every tree can be told by its own fruit: people do not pick figs from thorns, nor gather grapes from brambles. A good man draws what is good from the store of goodness in his heart; a bad man draws what is bad from the store of badness. For a man's words flow out of what fills his heart.'

### WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

In his message for Lent this year, Pope Francis has written:

The soil is prepared by fasting, watered by prayer and enriched by charity. Let us believe firmly that "if we do not give up, we shall reap our harvest in due time" and that, with the gift of perseverance, we shall obtain what was promised (cf. *Heb* 10:36), for our salvation and the salvation of others (cf. *1 Tim* 4:16). By cultivating fraternal love towards everyone, we are united to Christ, who gave his life for our sake (cf. *2 Cor* 5:14-15), and we are granted a foretaste of the joy of the kingdom of heaven, when God will be "all in all" (*1 Cor* 15:28).

Our Lent this year will begin in a climate of dismay at the Russian invasion of the Ukraine. Just days before the war began, as the threat to peace grew, the Holy Father invited everyone to make Ash Wednesday a day of fasting for peace. Now that the bloodshed has begun, his call is even more poignant. Sadly, there are also other regions and countries affected by warfare and oppression, in Africa, the Middle East and elsewhere. If you would find a "theme" helpful for your Lent this year, it would be good to make it "peace."




