℟: **Amen.**

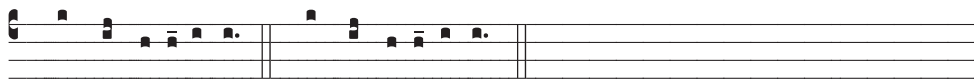

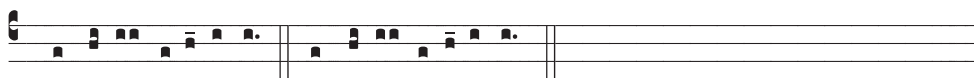



HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

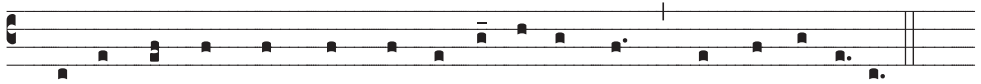
COMMUNION RITE

℟: **For the kingdom, the power and the glo-ry are yours now and for ev-er.**

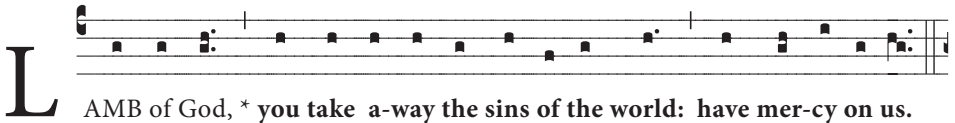

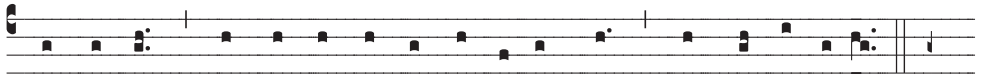
