# FIRST READING Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

A reading from the book of Genesis

God made a covenant with Abraham, his faithful servant.

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcasses but Abram drove them off.

Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

A reminder that this Wednesday, 16<sup>th</sup> March, is the anniversary of death of Archbishop Polding (1877) and of Cardinal Freeman (1991), the First and the Sixth Archbishops of Sydney. May they rest in peace. Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> is St Patrick's Day, and Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> is St Joseph's Day, so it is quite a special week.

The Gospel on the Second Sunday of Lent each year is that of the Transfiguration of Jesus. This year, "Year C" we have Luke's account (Luke 9.28-36) while the parallel passages in Matthew and Mark are read in Years A and B respectively.

How welcome and reassuring is the remembrance of Christ's glory, his divinity shining forth in his humanity: for he is the source of our hope for eternal life, and our only light in the midst of the darkness that tries to enfold the world from time to time, notably now in the horrible war in Ukraine.

And after what felt like months of cloud and rain, and life-changing floods affecting so many, a few hours of bright sunshine this week were another transfiguration, and a reminder that the Lord is merciful and loving.




