THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



FIRST READING Isaiah 43:16-21 (Year C)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah I am doing a new thing and I will give drink to my people. Thus says the Lord, who made a way through the sea, a path in the great waters; who put chariots and horse in the field and a powerful army, which lay there never to rise again, snuffed out, put out like a wick: No need to recall the past, no need to think about what was done before. See, I am doing a new deed, even now it comes to light; can you not see it? Yes, I am making a road in the wilderness, paths in the wilds. The wild beasts will honour me, jackals and ostriches, because I am putting water in the wilderness (rivers in the wild) to give my chosen people drink. The people I have formed for myself will sing my praises.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM *Ps 125 (Year C)*

R. The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.

When the Lord delivered Zion from bondage, it seemed like a dream. Then was our mouth filled with laughter, on our lips there were songs. *R*.

The heathens themselves said: 'What marvels the Lord worked for them!' What marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed we were glad. *R*. Deliver us, O Lord, from our bondage as streams in dry land. Those who are sowing in tears will sing when they reap. *R*.

They go out, they go out, full of tears, carrying seed for the sowing: they come back, they come back, full of song, carrying their sheaves. *R*.

SECOND READING *Philippians 3:8-14 (Year C)*

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians

Because of Christ I look upon everything else as useless in order to gain him.

I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won. All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.

GOSPEL John 8:1-11 (Year C)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Let the person without sin be the first to throw a stone.

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again; and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them.

The scribes and Pharisees brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this to death by stoning. What have you to say?' They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him. But Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger. As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again. When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there. He looked up and said, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one, sir,' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus 'go away, and don't sin any more.'

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

Round about now, many Catholics are thinking, with regret, "I haven't quite kept as good a Lent as I should have." Well, there's still time to keep the last weeks of Lent better, with some prayer and penance. Don't give up!

From today, the Fifth Sunday, we enter the section of Lent known as "Passiontide." During this time, the liturgy draws into a more intense preparation to commemorate the Lord's passion. The Gospel readings at Mass during this week are from Chapters 8, 10 and 11 of St John, and the Old Testament readings include such evocative stories as Susannah and the elders in the Book of Daniel, the bronze serpent in the Book of Numbers, and the three young men thrown into the burning fiery furnace by King Nebuchadnezzar in the Book of Daniel.

So next Sunday is "Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord."

The Blessing of Palms and Procession will begin at 10.30 next Sunday, in the cathedral grounds. The Solemn Mass will follow the Procession.

As many people as possible ought to join in the Procession, and only the infirm should wait inside the cathedral for the Procession to arrive.

In the (unlikely?) event of wet weather, we will gather in the Crypt and process from there into the cathedral.

Small palm leaves will be available, but I would encourage you to bring your own branches of palm or olive to be blessed, carry in procession, and take home.

Meanwhile, let's continue to pray for peace in Ukraine and in the whole world. It was really great to have so very many people in the cathedral at three o'clock in the morning last Saturday for the Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Over 1,000 were present!


Prayer for Unity and Peace with the songs of Taizé
