A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

The Palm Sunday Procession, the "Gateway to Holy Week," is not simply a commemoration of something that happened in the past - Our Lord's entry into Jerusalem - although it does commemorate that. No, it also impacts on our present lives, and we are also drawn into an experience of our future in Christ.

In the Procession, as we march along, we march in company with Our Lord into the battle between life and death. We know the outcome of this contest: Jesus Christ will be the conqueror of death and sin. So we accompany Him on this journey into Jerusalem to die on the Cross as we would accompany a friend who was going to die for a great cause. Christ is a hero, the hero of all time, and we are with him. We Catholics are not bystanders to the events of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection throughout Holy Week: by our communion with him we are sharers in that passion, death, and resurrection to eternal life.


Holy Week is not something to watch, it is something to live.


