THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



FIRST READING Acts 15:1-2, 22-29

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to burden you beyond what is essential.

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

SECOND READING Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

A reading from the book of the Apocalypse

He showed me the holy city coming down out of heaven.

In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel or crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.

WORD FROM THE CATHEDRAL CLERGY



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

THE WAY OF MARY

For the month of May, we can say a few words about several stages on Mary's life's way, stages we can experience in our own lives too:

- i) The first event in Mary's Life is the Annunciation, when the Word became flesh in her womb. As a devout Jewish woman, for her, the Bible was her source of life and inspiration. We know from her use of the word 'lowliness' that her whole existence was oriented towards God, making a complete gift of herself to the One who, on this day, was no longer speaking through the prophets, but sending his Son. Now she's responding to the Trinitarian Face of God: she's told the Lord that is God the Father is with her, that she will conceive a Son, and that the Holy Spirit will come down upon her. This revelation has been called 'an apocalypse at the beginning of the Gospel,' not at the end: the spiritual outbreak of a new world. So what we're focusing on, as a first stage in her life, is for us an invitation to unite ourselves with her Immaculate Heart and remake our own choice of God-Love, answering that Love with our own "Yes".
- ii) The second episode in Mary's Life is her visit to Elizabeth. 'Mary first tells by deeds of love and later by the words of love. Her visitation shows us how much Mary's 'yes' relates her to others. She goes 'in haste, to visit and help her cousin. It's the faith that's expressed in charity. And through Elizabeth, the Spirit proclaims the first beatitude of the Gospel, 'blessed she who believed.' It's like the new name for all those who hear the word of God and put it into practise. From her openness to the great things of God, Mary breaks into a song of humble praise, with its thread of gold uniting past, present and future. Her change of situation isn't only religious, but has political, social and economic implications. Ephrem of Syria remarked that when she says that from now on all generations will call me blessed, from that time, the new Reign of God began to be preached.
- **THE THIRD EVENT IN MARY'S LIFE IS THE BIRTH OF JESUS,** the Emmanuel who is God-with-us. We love, and sooner or later we're loved in return because almost everyone responds to love. This mutual love brings about the presence of Jesus among people. It's a continuous giving birth to Jesus in the community. And we'll be able to give Jesus spiritually to the world as Mary gave him physically.

- **iv)** Mary Presents Her Son in the Temple and meets the old Simeon. It is a moment of joy for her, because this just and holy man confirms that her child is the Son of God. The first stages of the Way of Mary have been joyful, but now there's the message of sorrow. Simeon turns to her and says: "And a sword will pierce through your own soul also." This is like a second annunciation, the annunciation of the Cross in her life. The widening out of the old Covenant to all of humanity, to come about through the death and resurrection of her Son, will involve Mary too.
- v) Mary's Losing Jesus when he's twelve Years old. He stops in Jerusalem to speak with the doctors in the temple. This looks like a prequel for the losing that will mark Mary's life when she'll be standing beside the Cross. Mary suffers from her not understanding her loss of Jesus in the Temple. When she finds him again, she asks, 'Son, why have you treated us like this?' There, in the Temple, the place where the Father is present, Jesus' complete and exclusive abandonment to his Father is very clear. And, in this first recorded statement of Jesus, reported by Luke, Mary is made aware of Jesus' independence of family ties.
- vi) AND NOW COMES THE HOUR OF IMMOLATION FOR MARY, STANDING BY THE CROSS, HER SECOND 'YES' TO GOD, what has been called her second motherhood, of the Church. (78) Like two separate columns, close to each other, but unable to touch each other, he was 'parallel' to Mary. When he as it were, dispossessed her of being his mother by appointing her mother of John, she felt cut off from the one she loved the most, as he was cut off from the one of whom he'd said, 'I and the Father are one'. Yet in his forsakenness and her desolation they were never more one in doing the Father's will. Pope Francis says of this moment: 'Mary unites herself to her Son in the martyrdom of the heart and in the offering of life to the Father for the salvation of humanity. Our Lady made her own the pain of her Son and with Him accepted the Father's will, in that obedience that bears fruit, which gives the true victory over evil and death.'
- vii) And after the desolation? MARY IS MOTHER OF THE CHURCH, AT THE CENTRE OF THE UPPER ROOM with all her maternal charism towards the Apostles, alongside Peter whom Jesus had constituted their head. 'All these joined in continuous prayer, together with several women, including Mary, the mother of Jesus...' Mary through her second 'yes' now finds herself at the centre of the Church in a motherhood that generates Christ in his Body through the Holy Spirit.
- viii) Then, <u>THE ASSUMPTION</u>, <u>WHEN GOD CALLS MARY</u>, <u>BODY AND SOUL</u>, <u>INTO HEAVEN</u>. This is the eschatological reality of Mary vanquishing the Evil One and involved in the whole work of salvation. In her assumption into heaven we can see where the whole created universe is heading and has its aim fulfilled in the creature Mary, The fact that she has her immaculate heart filled with love for all her children means she's never far from us when we need her.
- **MARY AS QUEEN OF HEAVEN AND EARTH:** Her mission as mother was due to her lowliness, now expressed by her continuous presence in the Church. Mary as the high point of all creation, who in her being conceived without sin is the image of Eden, the perfection God originally planned for the whole human race, and eventually found in her.

THIS IS THE WAY OF MARY, a journey which each one of us takes, although in different ways, depending our response and on the graces that God freely bestows on whomever he wills.






