

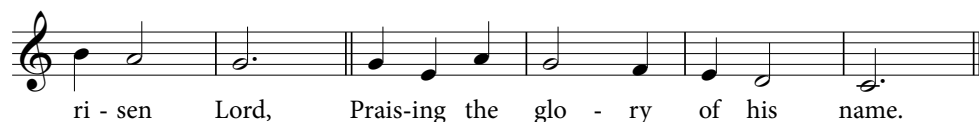

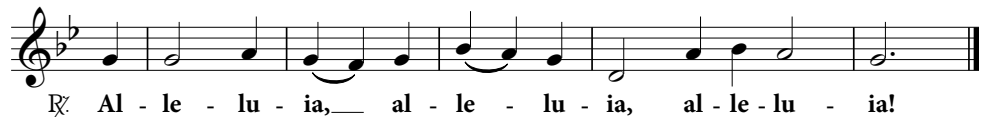

PROFESSION OF FAITH


# COMMUNION RITE



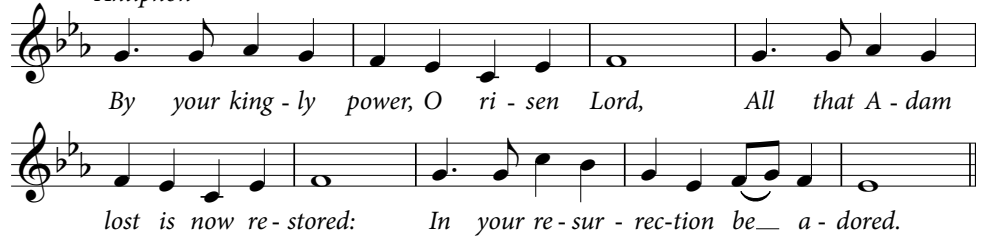

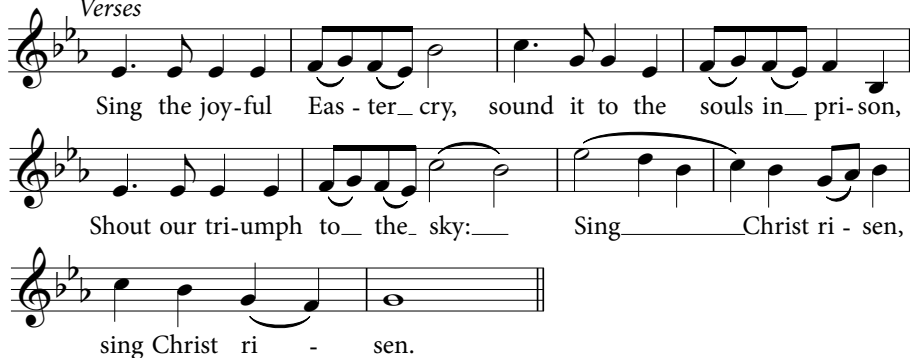
