

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



FIRST READING Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

SECOND READING Romans 8:8-17 (Year C)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God.

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

On this great feast of Pentecost, we have a special celebration at the 10.30 Solemn Mass of Confirmation for adults from all across the Archdiocese. We welcome them all, together with their families and friends.

May the Holy Spirit soak deeply into our being, bringing about that communion with Our Lord which brings eternal life. May the Holy Spirit remind us of all that Jesus has handed on to us from the Father, so that the Church may fulfil the mission given to her by the Risen Lord: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28.19)

At this time we are also celebrating the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have prepared a prayer for this occasion, which we shall use in the absence of anything prepared by the Australian Catholic Bishops (who were probably distracted by thinking about the umpteen new boards, committees, round-table conferences and discussion forums to be proposed at the forthcoming Plenary Council session).

Almighty God, we pray, that your servant Elizabeth, our Queen, who, by your providence has received the governance of this realm, may continue to grow in every virtue, that, imbued with your heavenly grace, she may be preserved from all that is harmful and evil and, being blessed with your favour may, with the royal family, come at last into your presence, through Christ who is the way, the truth and the life and who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Amen.

Finally, it has been an interesting couple of weeks at the cathedral, with a full Police and HAZMAT response to a suspicious object placed inside, and also the theft of several metres of expensive custom made copper downpipe from the cathedral walls. The life of the Church and the Christian people may be animated by the Holy Spirit, and oriented towards eternity, but it is very much lived in this world!





News on the Plenary Council of the Catholic Church in Australia



Give us the grace to see your face in one another and to recognise Jesus, our companion on the road.


Give us the courage to tell our stories and to speak boldly of your truth.

Lead your Church into a hope-filled future, that we may live the joy of the Gospel.


