A reading from the prophet Isaiah

It does not matter if a person is circumcised or not; what matters is for him to become an altogether new creature. Peace and mercy to all who follow this rule, who form the Israel of God.

GOSPEL Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *Your peace will rest upon him.*

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

This weekend the Church in Australia marks "Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday". Every year, on the first Sunday in July, Catholics come together across Australia to acknowledge and celebrate the gifts of Australia's First Peoples in the Catholic Church.

It will be a busy week here at St Mary's Cathedral, and an important one: the Fifth Plenary Council of the Church in Australia is holding its meetings in the Cathedral College, with a Mass each day in the cathedral. We have changed the cathedral Mass schedule for the week ahead: please see the special notice. And we will have a period of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament each morning so that everyone can come and pray for the success of the Plenary Council and for the guidance of the Holy Spirit on all its Members, especially the Bishops who must deliberate on what is proposed and discussed.

Now, on the subject of the Cathedral College, in whose rooms the Plenary Council will be meeting: The Archdiocese and Sydney Catholic Schools have been looking at the needs of Catholic schooling in the inner city. The unique circumstances, history and opportunities for Catholic education at St Mary's Cathedral now allow for a reimagining of what St Mary's Cathedral College might offer to the community going forward. This is especially important for us as in regard to the recruitment and education of the boys of the Cathedral Choir, who attend the Cathedral College, but also touches on the bigger picture of what a Cathedral School could be in the 21st Century. I would like to invite the Cathedral parish community to learn more about the possible new models for how schooling at St Mary's Cathedral might be provided. Elsewhere in this bulletin you will see a letter from the Executive Director Sydney Catholic Schools, Mr Tony Farley, outlining how you can learn more. There are some really interesting possibilities.


