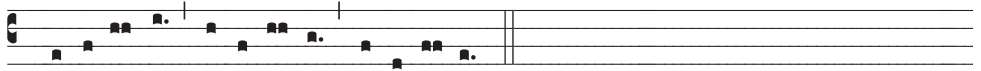

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

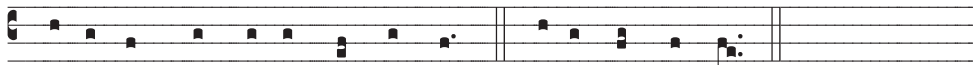




