FIRST READING Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13

A reading from the prophet Zephaniah In your midst I will leave a humble and a lowly people.

Seek the Lord all you, the humble of the earth, who obey his commands. Seek integrity, seek humility: you may perhaps find shelter on the day of the anger of the Lord. In your midst I will leave a humble and lowly people, and those who are left in Israel will seek refuge in the name of the Lord. They will do no wrong, will tell no lies; and the perjured tongue will no longer be found in their mouths. But they will be able to graze and rest with no one to disturb them.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 145:7-10

R. Happy the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs!

It is the Lord who keeps faith for ever, who is just to those who are oppressed. It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the Lord, who sets prisoners free. *R*.

It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down, the Lord, who protects the stranger and upholds the widow and orphan. *R*.

It is the Lord who loves the just but thwarts the path of the wicked. The Lord will reign for ever, Zion's God, from age to age. *R*.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 1:26\u201331

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians God has chosen what is weak by human reckoning.

Take yourselves, brothers, at the time when you were called: how many of you were wise in the ordinary sense of the word, how many were influential people, or came from noble families? No, it was to shame the wise that God chose what is foolish by human reckoning, and to shame what is strong that he chose what is weak by human reckoning; those whom the world thinks common and contemptible are the ones that God has chosen - those who are nothing at all to show those who are everything. The human race has nothing to boast about to God, but you, God has made members of Christ Jesus and by God's doing he has become our wisdom, and our virtue, and our holiness, and our freedom. As scripture says: if anyone wants to boast, let him boast about the Lord.

'How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentle: they shall have the earth for their heritage. Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted. Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied. Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them. Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God. Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God. Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

A warm welcome to you all, as for many the holiday season now ends and work and school begin again. I had been hoping for a nice quiet January myself, but it didn't turn out that way...

I know many of you will want to pray for and pay your respects to the late Cardinal Pell in the time leading up to his funeral and burial, as well as being present for the funeral Mass. The Cardinal's body will be received into the cathedral on Wednesday 1st at 9.30am, and will lie in state for visitation and prayers all that day, with Mass at 1.10pm Evening Prayer at 5.30pm and another Mass at 8.00pm, after which the cathedral will close. For the funeral Mass itself on Thursday 2nd, we are making special arrangements to allow as many people as possible to be present for this historic moment, and there will be video screens and sound in the cathedral square for those unable to get a seat inside.

I also want to mention the funeral of the late Fr John de Luca, which takes place this Tuesday afternoon in St Mary's Parish Church at Maroubra Bay. Fr de Luca served here at St Mary's Cathedral in the 1970's and, as an accomplished musician himself, contributed to preserving and promoting sacred music here and elsewhere. In retirement he maintained a strong interest in the cathedral's musical life. May he rest in peace.

May Christ, who said "blessed are those who mourn," bless all of you and your families in the week ahead.




A message from the Archdiocese of Sydney:
