#### THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF EASTER AND THE MOVEABLE FEASTS

**K**NOW, dear brethren (brothers and sisters), that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Saviour. On the twenty-second day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the ninth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-first day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-eighth day of May, the feast of Pentecost. On the eleventh day of June the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the third day of December, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

#### PROFESSION OF FAITH

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
