FIRST READING Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18

A reading from the book of Leviticus *You must love your neighbour, as yourself.*

The Lord spoke to Moses; he said: 'Speak to the whole community of the sons of Israel and say to them: "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy."
"You must not bear hatred for your brother in your heart. You must openly tell him, your neighbour, of his offence; this way you will not take a sin upon yourself. You must not exact vengeance, nor must you bear a grudge against the children of your people. You must love your neighbour as yourself. I am the Lord.'

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians All things are yours, but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

Make no mistake about it; if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: The Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he knows how useless they are; or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all your servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

GOSPEL Matthew 5:38-48

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *Love your enemies.*

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

Today is the last Sunday before Lent, so penance should be on our mind. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, if you are over 14 years of age you are bound by the precepts of the Church to not eat meat.

The Australian bishops suppose that you have the maturity to take seriously your obligations, and so have left room for your own choice in what penitential practices you will embrace on the other Fridays of Lent. So, in the dioceses of this country, you can eat meat on the Fridays of Lent, provided you undertake some other penance in the form of prayer and/or self denial and/or, or helping others.

Frankly, I'm not sure the bishops are right on this: I think there is a lot to be said for a simple, distinct and common penance like no meat on Fridays, as we did for centuries - but perhaps I'm wrong. Anyway, as an additional or alternative penance you might try attending the Stations of the Cross devotion in the cathedral each Friday in Lent beginning at 12.15pm, or making the Stations individually at any convenient time...

And there are many "unseen" penances you might do as well, such as making an extra effort to spend time with family or neighbours.

Every blessing for the week ahead – especially Ash Wednesday!
