THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



FIRST READING Isaiah 58:7-10

A reading from the prophet Isaiah Your light will shine like the dawn.

Thus says the Lord:

Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shine like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over. Your integrity will go before you and the glory of the Lord behind you. Cry, and the Lord will answer; call, and he will say, 'I am here.' If you do away with the yoke, the clenched fist, the wicked word, if you give your bread to the hungry, and relief to the oppressed, your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 111:4-9

R. A light rises in the darkness for the upright.

He is a light in the darkness for the upright: he is generous, merciful and just. The good man takes pity and lends, he conducts his affairs with honour. **R**.

The just man will never waver: he will be remembered for ever. He has no fear of evil news; with a firm heart he trusts in the Lord. *R*.

With a steadfast heart he will not fear; open-handed, he gives to the poor; his justice stands firm for ever. His head will be raised in glory. *R*.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians *I came to you to proclaim Christ crucified*.

When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION John 8:12

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the light of the world, says the Lord; the man who follows me will have the light of life. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Matthew 5:13-16

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew You are the light of the world.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men.

'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.'

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

Today, the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Church in Australia holds "Word of God Sunday". (The rest of the world keeps it on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, when Aussies are still on holidays at the beach.)

It's a good opportunity early in the year to think about your relationship to the Holy Scriptures, and to the living Word himself. From the sacred page as we read, in the prayers and chants of the liturgy as we participate, in the Sacraments as we receive them, the Word of God is written within us. Word of God Sunday prompts us to pick up and "read" that Word. It is a "page-turner."

The past few days have been truly historic here at St Mary's, as we prayed together for Cardinal Pell and buried him in the crypt of the Mother Church of Australia. I want to place on record my profound gratitude to the cathedral staff who worked tirelessly and skilfully to make the Cardinal's funeral and associated arrangements so efficient, safe and beautiful. Likewise I thank those who volunteered their time and talent.

"Burying the dead", is one of the Seven Corporal Works of Mercy, and by it we show our respect for God's gift of our creation and life, and we give consolation to those who mourn. It is a way in which we put into practice that love for our neighbour that the Lord expects of us – perhaps an example of how we can "read" the Word of God.
