GOSPEL Matthew 17:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *His face shone like the sun.*

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him'. When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

The Gospel for this 2nd Sunday of Lent is the account of the Transfiguration of Jesus. In Lent, as we are disciplining our fleshly bodies, we are not rejecting our humanity but rather <u>purifying</u> it, seeking to remove the obstacles that stop us from sharing in the glory of divine light.

The Transfiguration reveals the divine nature, the divine glory, of Christ which is always there in him. Christ is one person having a human nature and a divine nature, but his divine nature was not always visible or apparent to those who saw him. But we might also say that Jesus, at the Transfiguration, shows in his human body the radiant beauty of human nature in its original state, created in the image and likeness of God, untainted by the Fall and sin. The Transfiguration of Christ gave the three apostles a glimpse of the paradise that was lost by sin and which we seek to regain in Christ: human nature redeemed, restored and transfigured by the grace of Christ.

That's very much what our Lent is about: We are all called to share in Christ's glory - having first of all shared in his effort, his struggle, his life of humility and suffering. By the end of Lent, we hope to have removed from our lives many of the flaws that prevent to that radiant light of Christ shining in and shining out from us.







The Archdiocese has a legal obligation to report crimes to the police






