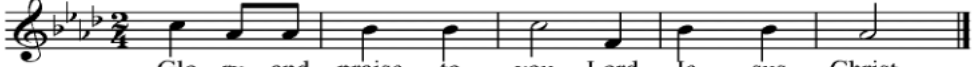

PROFESSION OF FAITH






