## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



### FIRST READING Acts 2:14, 36-41

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ.

On the day of Pentecost Peter stood up with the eleven and addressed the crowd with a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.'

Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent,' Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation.' They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

#### SECOND READING 1 Peter 2:20-25

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

You had gone astray but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty.

This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

#### GOSPEL John 10:1-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John *I am the gate of the sheepfold.* 

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.

So Jesus spoke to them again:

'I tell you most solemnly,
I am the gate of the sheepfold.
All others who have come
are thieves and brigands;
but the sheep took no notice of them.
I am the gate.
Anyone who enters through me will be safe:
he will go freely in and out

and be sure of finding pasture.
The thief comes
only to steal and kill and destroy.
I have come
so that they may have life
and have it to the full.'

### WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

As Pope St John XXIII wrote in his 1963 Encylical *Pacem in Terris*, "Human society can be neither well-ordered nor prosperous without the presence of those who, invested with legal authority, preserve its institutions and do all that is necessary to sponsor actively the interests of all its members."

The Coronation of King Charles III occurs on Saturday May 6<sup>th</sup>, in the evening Sydney time. Every Coronation since at least that of King Edward VII in 1902 has been acknowledged here at St Mary's Cathedral in various ways, with prayers and *Te Deums* and joyful bellringing, giving thanks for the blessings of the lawful authority and government for the common good which is embodied in the Monarch.

Hence, on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May a solemn *Te Deum* will be sung at the conclusion of the 10.30am Mass, and in the afternoon our bellringers will ring a special peal.

The blessings of stable government, the rule of law, and of peace, should never be taken for granted. We do very well to pray for those gifts.




THE WELFARE OF AUSTRALIA
