THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



FIRST READING Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

SECOND READING Ephesians 1:17-23

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians He made Jesus to sit at his right hand in heaven.

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Today (Sunday) at the 10.30am Solemn Mass we especially welcome recipients of the Dempsey Medal, which is awarded by the Archbishop to recognize those who have made an outstanding contribution to the life of the Archdiocese, usually in the context of their local parish. Congratulations!

This Wednesday we celebrate the feastday of Our Lady Help of Christians. This is a major celebration for us: under the title "Help of Christians" the Blessed Virgin Mary is Patroness of Australia and of this Cathedral. I hope you can join us in prayer on Wednesday. The young men of the Cathedral Scholars will be singing at Vespers (5.00pm) and Mass (5.30pm).

Next Saturday, 27th May, the 6.00pm Mass will be the special Vigil of Pentecost, at which there are several beautiful Readings and Psalms, which speak of God's promised Holy Spirit – a little like the Easter Vigil but simpler. The texts are unique to the Saturday evening before Pentecost Sunday, and are a wonderful way of preparing for a fruitful Pentecost.

On Pentecost Sunday 28th May at the 10.30am Mass, the sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred upon a number of adults from around the Archdiocese. We are looking forward to welcoming the candidates and their sponsors, families and friends.

The Holy See has asked for special prayers to Our Lady on the Feast of the Visitation, 31st May, in preparations for the forthcoming sessions of the Synod on Synodality which will be held in Rome in October. The Australian Bishops have nominated St Mary's Cathedral Sydney as the major Marian Shrine in Australia where these special prayers will be held. You are warmly invited to come and entrust the work of the Synod to Our Lady on Wednesday 31st May, with Mass at 5.30pm to be followed by Rosary and other prayers. I would really encourage you to join us in this moment of Marian prayer – the Synod needs all the prayers and heavenly patronage it can get!


