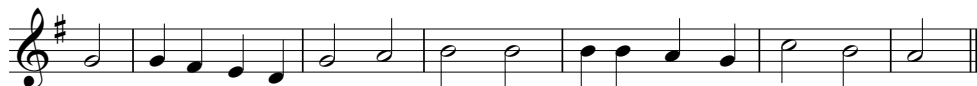

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

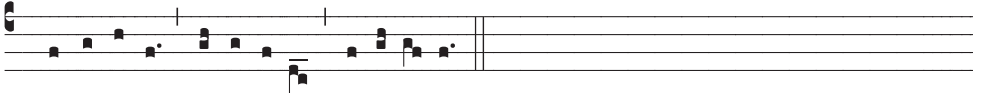

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

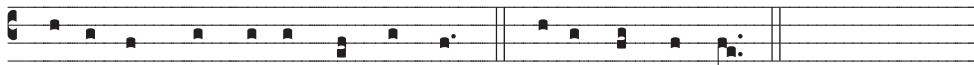

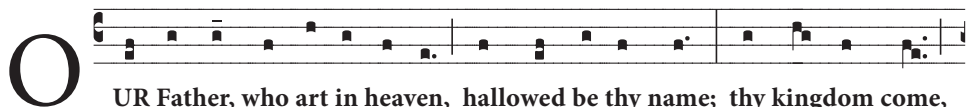

# COMMUNION RITE

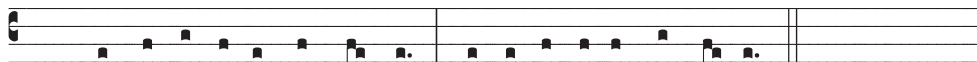
At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:



thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our dai-ly bread,

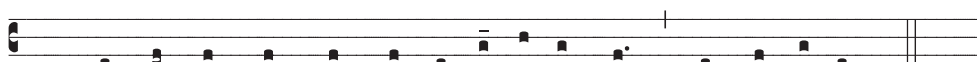


and forgive us our trespasses, as we for-give those who trespass a-gainst us;
