FIRST READING 1 Kings 3:5, 7-12

A reading from the first book of the Kings You have asked for wisdom.

The Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream and said, 'Ask what you would like me to give you.' Solomon replied, 'Lord, my God, you have made your servant king in succession to David my father. But I am a very young man, unskilled in leadership. Your servant finds himself in the midst of this people of yours that you have chosen, a people so many its numbers cannot be counted or reckoned. Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil, for who could govern this people of yours that is so great?' It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked for this. 'Since you have asked for this' the Lord said 'and not asked for long life for yourself or riches or the lives of your enemies, but have asked for a discerning judgement for yourself, here and now I do what you ask. WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

The week ahead is full of interesting feast days, which should prompt us to a bit more holiness in our own lives.

On Monday 31st July: St Ignatius Loyola (1491-1566), priest, founder of the Jesuits. We have the Jesuit Fathers caring for our neighbouring parish of St Canice's in Kings Cross/Elizabeth Bay, and of course Pope Francis is a Jesuit. St Ignatius began a movement of truly extraordinary religious vigor and his spiritual insights continue to inspire many people today.

On Tuesday 1st August: St Alphonsus Mary de' Ligouri (1696-1787), bishop, Doctor of the Church. St Alphonsus was a prolific writer, especially on matters of moral theology, but also on Our Lady and numerous other topics, and founded the Redemptorist order of priests, who are present here in the Archdiocese.

On Wednesday 2nd: here in the cathedral we will commemorate St Peter Julian Eymard (1811-1868), priest, because we have a church dedicated to this saint within our Cathedral parish boundaries: St Peter Julian's at Haymarket. St Peter Julian founded the Blessed Sacrament Fathers, and it is a blessing to have their Eucharistic shrine on busy George Street.

This Wednesday, being August 2nd, is also the day of the "Portiuncula Indulgence", when the grant of a Plenary Indulgence may be gained by visiting a Basilica, Cathedral or Parish Church (and St Mary's Cathedral is all three of those – but you can only gain the indulgence once on the day!) and praying and Our Father and the Creed, and fulfilling the other usual requirements of Confession, Communion and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father.

On Thursday 3rd: St Dominic (1170-1221), founder of the Order of Preachers, to which our own Archbishop Anthony Fisher belongs. The Dominicans are also our neighbours at St Benedict's, Broadway, St Bede's, Pyrmont and St James', Forest Lodge. (In most countries St Dominic is commemorated on August 8th, but in Australia our own St Mary's MacKillop's commemoration is on that date.)

Thursday is also the anniversary of death in 2014 of Cardinal Edward Clancy, Seventh Archbishop of Sydney.

On Friday 4th: St John Mary Vianney (1786-1859), the famous "Curé of Ars", the Patron Saint of Parish Priests. His feast is a reminder to pray, please, for your priests.

On Saturday 5th: here in St Mary's we will commemorate the feast of the Dedication of the Basilica of St Mary Major in Rome, considered the oldest church in the West built in honour the Blessed Virgin Mary.

And then to cap all these saintly celebrations, next Sunday, August 6th, is the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord Jesus Christ! By his grace, may we all strive to become saints too.


