

#### FIRST READING Isaiah 56:1, 6-7

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

I will lead the foreigners to my holy mountain.

Thus says the Lord: Have a care for justice, act with integrity, for soon my salvation will come and my integrity be manifest.

Since their rejection meant the reconciliation of the world, do you know what their admission will mean? Nothing less than a resurrection from the dead! Just as you changed from being disobedient to God, and now enjoy mercy because of their disobedience, so those who are disobedient now - and only because of the mercy shown to you - will also enjoy mercy eventually. #### GOSPEL Matthew 15:21-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *Woman, you have great faith.*

## WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

The scriptures speak in a general way about the fulfilment of God's will that all peoples come to Him, but we recall also what Jesus said in the parable of the Wedding Feast: everyone was invited, but the one who turned up without appropriate preparation was not able to partake.

I wish to make a few points about receiving Holy Communion.

People attend Mass here at the cathedral from many different parishes and from other countries, and may be accustomed to various ways of receiving Holy Communion. And some of us also get into some bad habits over the years. So:

1. In Australia Catholics may receive Holy Communion standing or kneeling. The exact wording in the Roman Missal is:

In the dioceses of Australia standing is the most common posture for receiving Holy Communion, though individual members of the faithful may choose to receive Communion while kneeling. When approaching to receive Holy Communion, the faithful bow in reverence of the Sacrament that they are to receive.

2. In Australia Catholics may receive Holy Communion on the tongue or in the hand. They are to respond "Amen" after the priest or minister says "The Body of Christ" before they receive. The exact wording in the Roman Missal is:

The Priest raises the host slightly and shows it to each, saying, The Body of Christ. The communicant replies, Amen, and receives the Sacrament either on the tongue or, where this is allowed, in the hand, the choice lying with the communicant.

I want to also emphasize the following:

1. If you are receiving on the tongue, <u>DO IT PROPERLY</u>. The minister is not supposed to have to put fingers into your mouth. You are supposed to open your mouth and extend your tongue to cover your front teeth. Nor should you poke your tongue right out. Open your mouth, extend your tongue slightly, and tilt your head back slightly.




2. If you are receiving on the hand, <u>DO IT PROPERLY</u>. Your hands should be bare, empty and clean. Place one hand open on top of the other so the minister can

place the host on the open palm of your hand.

Do not grab or nip the host from the minister.

Allow the minister to place the host on the palm of your hand. Then take the host with the fingers of your other hand and place it in your mouth, in the presence of the minister – do not walk away with the host!




