

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



#### FIRST READING Isaiah 22:19-23

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

I place the key of the House of David upon his shoulder.

Thus says the Lord of hosts to Shebna, the master of the palace:

I dismiss you from your office, I remove you from your post, and the same day I call on my servant Eliakim son of Hilkiah. I invest him with your robe, gird him with your sash, entrust him with your authority; and he shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and to the House of Judah. I place the key of the House of David on his shoulder; should he open, no one shall close, should he close, no one shall open. I drive him like a peg into a firm place; he will become a throne of glory for his father's house.

#### RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 137:1-3, 6, 8

#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Matthew 16:18

Alleluia, alleluia! You are Peter, the rock on which I will build my Church; the gates of hell will not hold out against it. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Matthew 16:13-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew You are Peter, to you I will give the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said, 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.

#### WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

The Gospel for this Sunday draws our thoughts to the role of the Apostle Peter and his successors in the life of the Church. St Mary's Cathedral, as it has been given the dignity of a Minor Basilica by the Pope (Pius XI in 1930), is a place to affirm in a special way our bonds of unity with the Pope and indeed the Church of Rome. Why is unity and fellowship with the Pope so important for us in the local Churches?

Back in 1998 the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith – then headed by Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, who became Pope Benedict XVI – published a series of reflections on "The Primacy of the Successor of Peter in the Mystery of the Church" and I would like to print here just a few of paragraphs from it:

"3. ...in the early Christian communities, as later throughout the Church, the image of Peter remained fixed as that of the Apostle who, despite his human weakness, was expressly assigned by Christ to the first place among the Twelve and was called to exercise a distinctive, specific task in the Church. He is the rock on which Christ will build his Church; Cf. Mt 16:18. he is the one, after he has been converted, whose faith will not fail and who will strengthen his brethren; Cf. Lk 22:32 lastly, he is the Shepherd who will lead the whole community of the Lord's disciples. Cf. Jn 21:15-17. Regarding the New Testament evidence on the primacy, cf. also John Paul II, Encyc. Let. *Ut unum sint*, nn. 90ff.

In Peter's person, mission and ministry, in his presence and death in Rome attested by the most ancient literary and archaeological tradition - the Church sees a deeper reality essentially related to her own mystery of communion and salvation: "*Ubi Petrus, ibi ergo Ecclesia*". St Ambrose of Milan, Enarr. in Ps., 40, 30: PL 14, 1134. From the beginning and with increasing clarity, the Church has understood that, just as there is a succession of the Apostles in the ministry of Bishops, so too the ministry of unity entrusted to Peter belongs to the permanent structure of Christ's Church and that this succession is established in the see of his martyrdom.

- 4. On the basis of the New Testament witness, the Catholic Church teaches, as a doctrine of faith, that the Bishop of Rome is the Successor of Peter in his primatial service in the universal Church; this succession explains the preeminence of the Church of Rome, Cf. St Ignatius of Antioch, Epist. ad Romanos, Introd.: SChr 10, 106-107; St Irenaeus of Lyons, Adversus Haereses, III, 3, 2: SChr 211, 32-33 enriched also by the preaching and martyrdom of St Paul...
- 15. The full communion which the Lord desires among those who profess themselves his disciples calls for the common recognition of a universal ecclesial ministry "in which all the Bishops recognize that they are united in Christ and all the faithful find confirmation for their faith".46 The Catholic Church professes that this ministry is the primatial ministry of the Roman Pontiff, Successor of Peter, and maintains humbly and firmly "that the communion of the particular Churches with the Church of Rome, and of their Bishops with the Bishop of Rome, is -- in God's plan -- an essential requisite of full and visible communion". John Paul II, Encyc. Let. Ut unum sint, n. 97. Human errors and even serious failings can be found in the history of the papacy: Peter himself acknowledged he was a sinner. Cf. Lk 5:8. Peter, a weak man, was chosen as the rock precisely so that everyone could see that victory belongs to Christ alone and is not the result of human efforts. Down the ages the Lord has wished to put his treasure in fragile vessels: Cf. 2 Cor 4:7. human frailty has thus become a sign of the truth of God's promises... "

You might care to visit the altar of St Peter in the cathedral, where there is a marble carving of Jesus giving the "keys" to St Peter, also depicted in the stained glass window above that altar, and offer a prayer for the unity of the Church, which Christ desires.

#### RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

- 1. In Australia Catholics may receive Holy Communion standing or kneeling.
- 2. In Australia Catholics may receive Holy Communion on the tongue or in the hand. They are to respond "Amen" after the priest or minister says "The Body of Christ" before they receive.

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

If you are receiving on the tongue, <u>DO IT PROPERLY</u>.
 The minister is not supposed to have to put fingers into your mouth. You are supposed to open your mouth and extend your tongue to cover your front teeth. Nor should you poke your tongue right out. Open your mouth, extend your tongue slightly, and tilt your head back slightly.



• If you are receiving on the hand, <u>DO IT PROPERLY</u>. Your hands should be bare, empty and clean. Place one hand open on top of the other so the minister can place the host on the open palm of your hand. Allow the minister to place the host on the palm of your hand. Then take the host with the fingers of your other hand and place it in your mouth, in the presence of the minister – do not walk away with the host!



 Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Communion. There are certain circumstances in which non-Catholic Christians may be admitted to receive Holy Communion – but this should be discussed personally with a priest well before Mass.


'Come & See' Steak Night - Thursday 31 August 2023

#### Mary MacKillop Australian Pilgrimage 17- 28 October 2023




