THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



FIRST READING Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

A reading from the book of Daniel *His raiment was as white as snow.*

As I watched: Thrones were set in place and one of great age took his seat. His robe was white as snow, the hair of his head as pure as wool. His throne was a blaze of flames. its wheels were a burning fire. A stream of fire poured out, issuing from his presence. A thousand thousand waited on him, ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. A court was held and the books were opened. I gazed into the visions of the night. And I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. He came to the one of great age and was led into his presence. On him was conferred sovereignty, glory and kingship, and men of all peoples, nations and languages became his servants. His sovereignty is an eternal sovereignty which shall never pass away, nor will his empire ever be destroyed.

The Lord is king, let earth rejoice, let all the coastlands be glad. Cloud and darkness are his raiment; his throne, justice and right. *R*.

The mountains melt like wax before the Lord of all the earth. The skies proclaim his justice; all peoples see he glory. **R**.

For you indeed are the Lord most high above all the earth exalted far above all spirits. *R*.

SECOND READING 2 Peter 1:16-19

A reading from the second letter of St Peter *We heard this voice from out of heaven.*

It was not any cleverly invented myths that we were repeating when we brought you the knowledge of the power and the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ; we had seen his majesty for ourselves. He was honoured and glorified by God the Father, when the Sublime Glory itself spoke to him and said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour.' We heard this ourselves, spoken from heaven, when we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have confirmation of what was said in prophecies; and you will be right to depend on prophecy and take it as a lamp for lighting a way through the dark until the dawn comes and the morning star rises in your minds.

Alleluia, alleluia! This is my Son, my beloved, in whom is all my delight: listen to him. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Matthew 17:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *His face was shining like the sun.*

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured: his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

WORD FROM THE DEAN



Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

This year we have the joy of celebrating the Feast of the Transfiguration, August 6th, on a Sunday, and it takes the place of the "18th Sunday in Ordinary Time". In fact every year on the Second Sunday of Lent the gospel passage of the Transfiguration of the Lord is read at Mass, but unless you are able to attend a weekday Mass in most years you miss celebrating this inspiring and inviting event in the life of Christ.

I find it a mystery of great encouragement. Although at the time only Peter John and James were to witness the transfiguration on the mountain, and they only came to understand it better after the Lord's death and resurrection, through their witness we too catch a glimpse of the true glory of Jesus, and we too hear the words of God the Father: "This is my Son, the Beloved; Listen to him."

As we turn to the Lord today, and worship him, we can make our own these words from the Byzantine liturgy:

On the Mountain You were Transfigured, O Christ God, And Your disciples beheld Your glory as far as they could see it; So that when they would behold You crucified, They would understand that Your suffering was voluntary, And would proclaim to the world, That You are truly the Radiance of the Father!

- Kontakion of the Transfiguration

Knowing this truth sustains us in our efforts to live out of Christian faith even when we find it difficult. Whatever sacrifices we have to make, whatever we have to let go of or to embrace for the sake of doing the Father's will, they are worth it for the glory that awaits us when we will stay with the Lord forever.

Looking to join a group and have the opportunity to meet other like-minded young adults?


then St Mary's Cathedral "EMBRACE" invites you to join them!
