HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

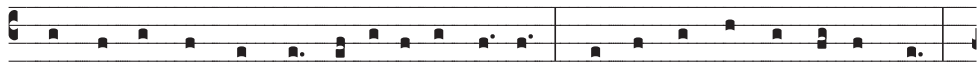
At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

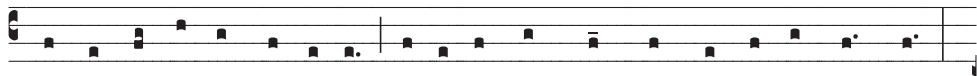

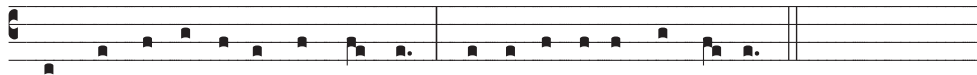
**UR Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come,**

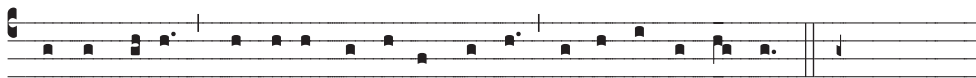

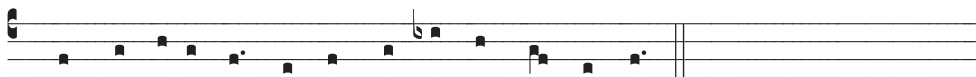
