RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 62:2-6, 8-9

You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Dear Cathedral Parishioners and Visitors,

Happy Fathers Day to all the fathers attending Mass at the cathedral this weekend!

Fatherhood is something special in God's plan for the human family. Keeping in mind the 4th Commandment, all fathers – good, bad and somewhere in the middle – deserve our prayers.

- 1. I, the Lord, am your God. You shall not have other gods besides me.
- 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain.
- 3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's day.
- 4. Honour your father and your mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbour's goods.

Today 3rd September is also a special day for our Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP: it is the 20th Anniversary of his Ordination as a Bishop! Congratulations Your Grace!

Fathers Day is also the day of our annual special Collection for the Priests Retirement Foundation, which helps look after the priests of our Archdiocese of Sydney who have grown older and retired. Your gift to the Priests Retirement Foundation plays an important role in providing retired priests with:

- A home and house to live in;
- Nursing care for frail priests;

- Health insurance, medical and dental expenses;
- Assistance to continue their priestly vocation and ministry in ways they can manage.

Speaking for my <u>future</u> self - since I expect I will be reliant on this support in another 15 years or so – I hope you can offer something to the Priests Retirement Foundation, but speaking for my <u>present</u> self and all my brother priests here, I hope you might spare us a prayer on this "Fathers Day" too.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

- 1. In Australia Catholics may receive Holy Communion standing or kneeling.
- 2. In Australia Catholics may receive Holy Communion on the tongue or in the hand. They are to respond "Amen" after the priest or minister says "The Body of Christ" before they receive.

PLEASE NOTE:

• If you are receiving on the tongue, <u>PLEASE DO IT PROPERLY</u>. The minister is not supposed to have to put fingers into your mouth. You are supposed to open your mouth and extend your tongue to cover your front teeth. Nor should you poke your tongue right out. Open your mouth, extend your tongue slightly, and tilt your head back slightly.



- If you are receiving on the hand, <u>PLEASE DO IT PROPERLY</u>. Your hands should be bare, empty and clean. Place one hand open on top of the other so the minister can place the host on the open palm of your hand. Allow the minister to place the host on the palm of your hand. Then take the host with the fingers of your other hand and place it in your mouth, in the presence of the minister do not walk away with the host!
- Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the
 reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches
 with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to
 Communion. There are certain circumstances in which non-Catholic Christians
 may be admitted to receive Holy Communion but this should be discussed
 personally with a priest well before Mass.




Looking to join a group and have the opportunity to meet other like-minded young adults?


then St Mary's Cathedral "EMBRACE" invites you to join them!


The group is run by our very own Fr Emmanuel Lubega.
