The Celebrant gives the absolution, saying

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

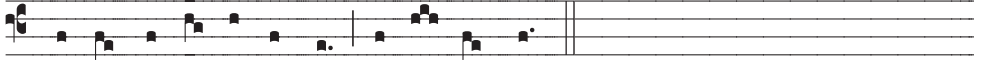

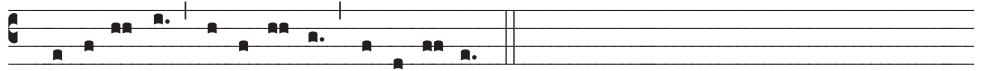

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

R: Amen.




